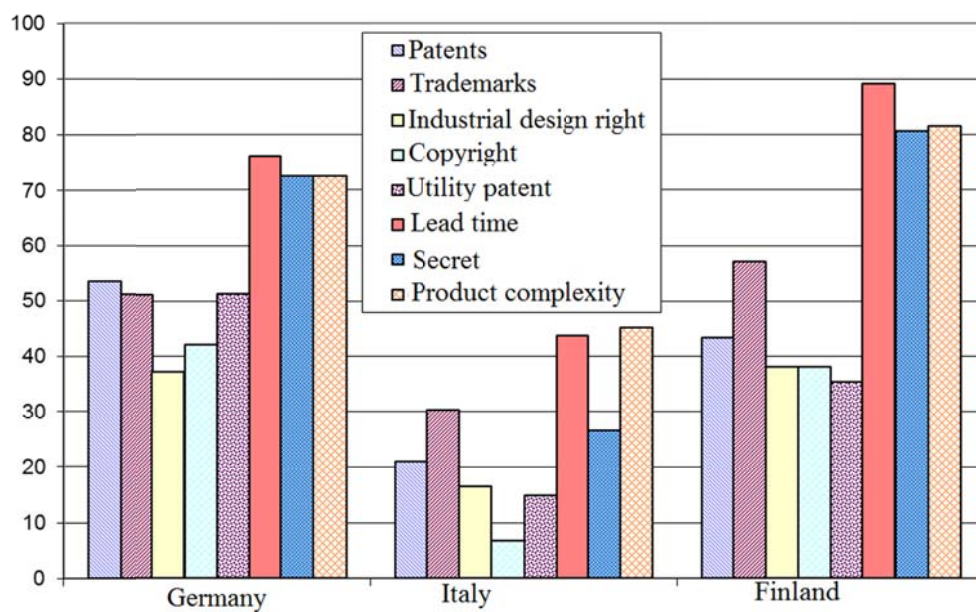


Figure 2.1. *The share of companies using some forms of protection to protect their innovations (sorted according to the location of the company; in %)*

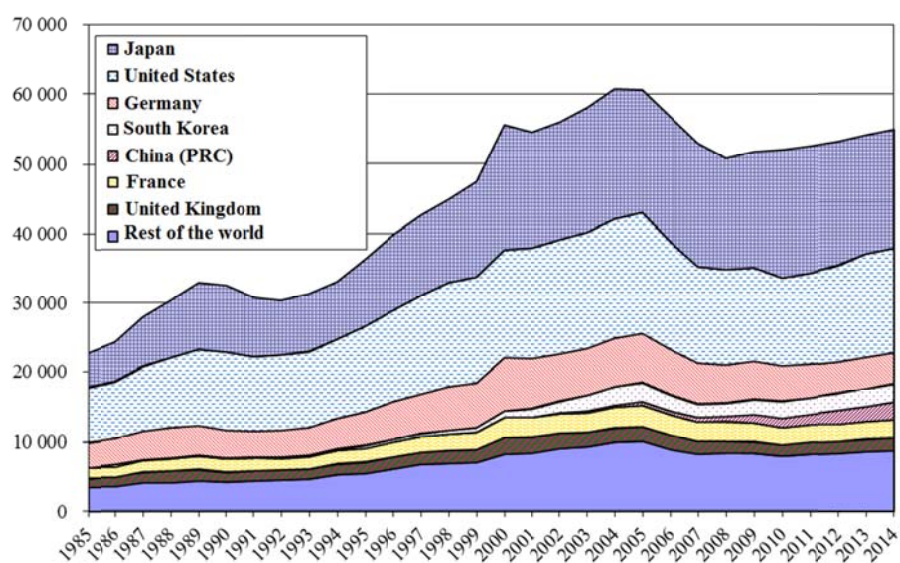


Figure 7.1. *The development of the number of triadic patent families (1985–2014)*¹

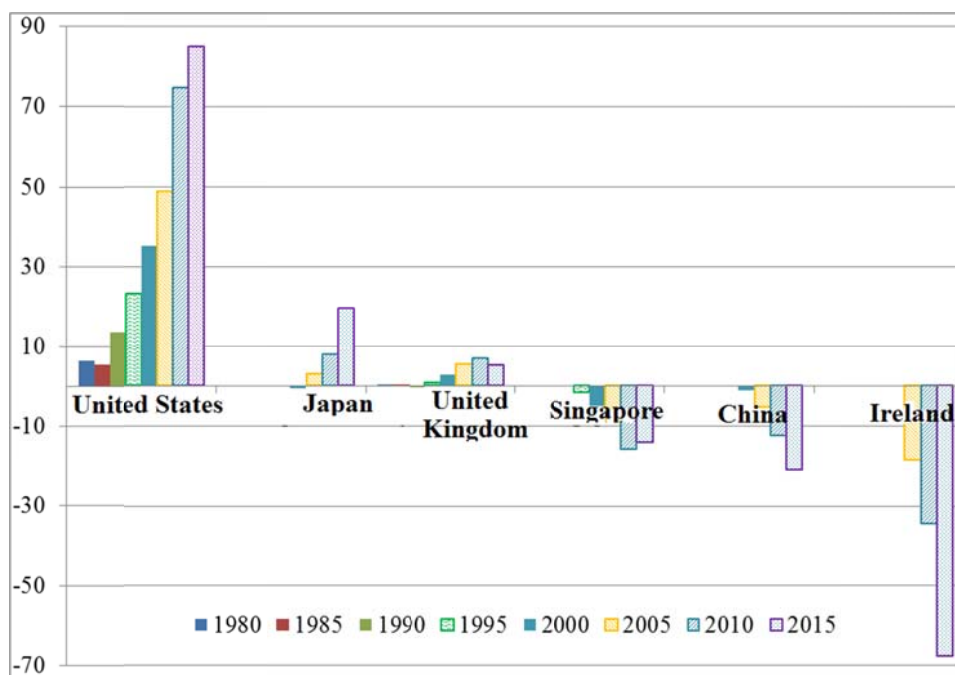


Figure 8.1. Balance between intellectual property income and payments (in billions of dollars at current prices)
